FATHER'S DAY

JUNE 16, 2019

Jon Warner Key Scripture Verse: Deut 6:4-9,
Mark 12:28-34

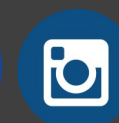
Father's Day serves as a reminder of the responsibilities that come with being a parent. Current trends see children who have been raised in the church tap out of their faith journey once they reach young adulthood. A deeply rooted theme in Scripture calls parents to serve as the primary spiritual influence in the lives of their kids. Serving as a multiple-times-a-day pledge of allegiance, the Shema oriented parents in their daily activity of child-raising. Jesus picks up the language of the Shema to call everyone to loving God and loving their neighbour. It is this calling that dads get to model each day for their families.

- 1) What one thought or idea from the sermon especially intrigued, provoked, disturbed, challenged, encouraged, warmed, warned, helped, or surprised you?
- 2) Do you have anything like the Shema in your life? Something that serves as a daily (or even regular) reminder of who you are trying to be?
- 3) Father's Day gives an opportunity to celebrate the father figures in your life. Is the thought of your dad associated more with positivity or negativity?
- 4) How we have experienced our own fathers can sometimes impact our view of God. Given the many metaphors and names for God given to us in the Scriptures, what is one that you are particularly drawn to? Why that one?
- 5) **RESPONSE:** Take time this week for quiet reflection. Think back on your experience of the father figure in your life. Reflect on where and how God was present and blessing through this person. Then think back on the moments that stand out that didn't go so well - times when you were hurt by your father figure. Give praise and thanksgiving for the blessed moments. Ask for healing and the strength to forgive for the difficult and painful moments. For better or worse, they helped form the person you are today.
